

- Closing date for appeals 31st March 2025

- 1. Cared for Children or previously cared for
- 2. Siblings.
- 3. Children resident within the designated catchment area of the school.
- 4. Children not resident within a school's local catchment area but attending a school designated a feeder primary.
- 5. Pupils living nearest to the school.
